2018 Pauling Medal Award Symposium

Nominations are now being accepted for the 2018 Linus Pauling Medal Award. The award is sponsored jointly by the Portland, Puget Sound, and Oregon sections of the American Chemical Society, and is presented annually in recognition of outstanding achievement in chemistry in the spirit of, and in honor of, Linus Pauling, a native of the Pacific Northwest. A nominee shall have made outstanding contributions to chemistry of a character that merit national and international recognition, however the award will not be given for work for which the nominee has already received a Nobel Prize. Scientists of all nationalities are eligible for this award. According to Pauling's express wish, it is preferred that the award honor younger scientists whenever possible.

Nominations close May 1st, 2018 at 5:00 pm PST.

Nominations from previous years will be automatically carried over for two years, after which new nominations will be required. Updating past nomination files is strongly encouraged.

The Medal will be presented at the 2018 Linus Pauling Medal Award Symposium to be held this fall at University of Washington, Bothell campus. Symposium event details will be announced after the winner is selected.



2018 Chemistry Olympiad

High school teachers and students are invited to participate in the 2018 U.S. National Chemistry Olympiad (USNCO) competition. This program is a multi-tiered competition that promotes excellence in high school chemistry.

Local qualifying competitions will be organized by ACS Local Sections in March 2018, to select nominees to sit for the National Exam April 17-23, 2018. Four students will represent the U.S. at the 50th International Chemistry Olympiad, which will be held jointly in Bratislava, Slovakia, and Prague, Czech Republic, July 19-29, 2018.

2018 Career Event Report

A report on the 14th annual Career Event of the Puget Sound Section of the ACS Written by Dr. Dharshi Bopegedera

It was exciting to see 82 undergraduate students, their faculty, and members of the ACS Puget Sound Section Executive Committee representing six different colleges, community colleges, and universities at the 14th Annual Career Event on January 31, The 2018. hosting institution, The Tacoma Center for Urban Waters



Laboratory is located at a former superfund site by the Thea Foss Waterway. Visitors to this laboratory can now enjoy beautiful views of the mountains in addition to a clean waterway within a very industrial setting; a testament to the men and women who continue to dedicate themselves to clean up this formerly polluted site.

The keynote speaker, Dr. Dr. Ed Kolodziej (Associate Professor, UW Tacoma, Interdisciplinary Arts and Sciences and Civil and Environmental Engineering, UW Seattle) gave a talk on "Chemistry and the environment: why Puget Sound needs clean water" with an emphasis on the kinds of pollutants that are found in the Puget Sound waterways and their impacts on wild life.

Students toured the laboratory facilities to get a closer look at the analytical instruments, personnel, and the research projects at this facility. The tour enabled students to ask questions from the laboratory staff first-hand, and learn about the education and training that is required to work at this laboratory.

The panel discussion, always a favorite of the participants, was staffed by members of the Tacoma Center for Urban Waters and moderated by Stuart Magoon, the Assistant Division Manager of the Science and Engineering Division. Panelists Bonnie McLeod, Kathy Peter, Alex Gipe, Nicole Riley, Mark Bozlee, Scott Redman, and Karen Bartlett spanned a wide range of educational and experience levels. They were eager to share their education and career aspirations and goals with our students and answered many questions raised by the audience.



Due to generous donations from Thermo Fisher Scientific, the Puget Sound Section of ACS, Despina Strong, and Dharshi Bopegedera, we raffled off many useful items such as a CRC Handbook of Chemistry and Physics, molecular model kits, book bags, books, and a periodic table blanket. 

Joseph Breen Memorial Fellowship

This award, administered by the ACS Green Chemistry Institute[®], will sponsor one or more young international green chemistry scholars to participate in a green chemistry technical meeting, conference, or training program. Awardees are reimbursed up to \$2,000 in funds to accommodate cost of travel, accommodation and fees associated with the event. Those who are eligible to apply include undergraduate and graduate students, post-doctoral fellows, and young professionals below the level of assistant professor and within the first seven years of their careers.

Kenneth G. Hancock Memorial Award

This award, administered by the ACS Green Chemistry Institute[®] and sponsored by the ACS Division of Environmental Chemistry and the National Institute of Standards & Technology, provides national recognition to students with outstanding contributions to furthering the goals of green chemistry through their research and/or studies. Recipients will win \$1,000 plus reimbursed travel to the annual Green Chemistry & Engineering Conference, held this year on June 18-20 in Portland, OR. The award is open to undergraduate and graduate students, regardless of citizenship or country of study. Students who completed their degrees prior to May 1 of the year before the application year are not eligible to apply.
