Younger Chemists Committee Member of the Month

Featuring Sean Dickson, Freshman at the University of Washington, Seattle Campus

Every month we, the Younger Chemists Committee, would like to recognize a member to be the *Younger Chemists Committee Member of the Month*. The mission of the Younger Chemists Committee is to advocate for and provide resources to early-career chemists and professionals in the chemical sciences and related fields. By highlighting a member each month, our hope is to present a stage for the member to share their experiences and any advice they may have for the rest of our committee membership.

“When you find [an interest], pursue it hard. You will have the baseline of your career set for you and from there you can take off.”

One of the greatest finds for a high school student is to find a path in which they are passionate about to further pursue in college. For Sean Dickson, his high school Biology and Chemistry classes helped solidify

his life path. Sean visited Harvard University with his cousin to meet American geneticist, molecular engineer, and chemist George Church, which helped catalyze his dream in owning a cutting-edge laboratory for biochemical research. In Sean's senior year of high school, he contacted Professor Mark Martin from University of Puget Sound in hopes to land a position in his lab. With ambition and a touch of luck, Sean was given the first insight into the world of research in Professor Mark's lab in which ultimately allowed him to continue research into college. Now, Sean has a solid interest in biological chemistry and hope to join labs researching genetics, genomics, and molecular biology during his undergraduate experience.

“My strategy for college is to become the best at what I do.”

Currently a freshman in college, Sean does more than attend classes. There are nearly unlimited available resources, such as social events and career growth opportunities, where he takes advantage of them and is not afraid to take a few risks. Joining the Younger Chemists Committee in October 2018 was one way that Sean achieved this. By attending panels, symposiums, and seminars, he is kept updated on the latest opportunities - invaluable to a college student, especially since these are the next generation of professionals.

We asked Sean for any advice that he had for both high school and college students.

“Find a deep interest in something. Try new things because it doesn't matter what the interest is as long as you enjoy it. Knock on doors, email professors, and get yourself in a lab if you are interested. I spent many years telling myself that research was only a “college thing” and I was 100% wrong. You CAN do research as a high schooler – you just have to be a little persistent. If you want a mentor in any sense, shoot them an email or just walk in their door. It really is amazing what that can do and nobody does it out of fear of rejection.” – Sean Dickson

Favorite element: Carbon, because it is objectively the coolest element.

Favorite compound: bicyclo[2.1.0]pentane (or Housane), look it up it's cool.

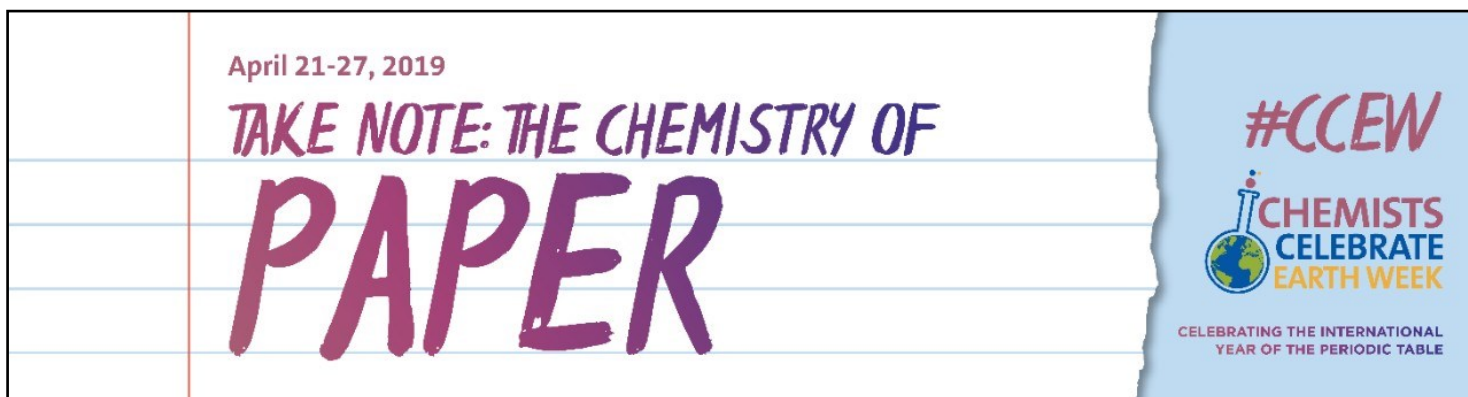

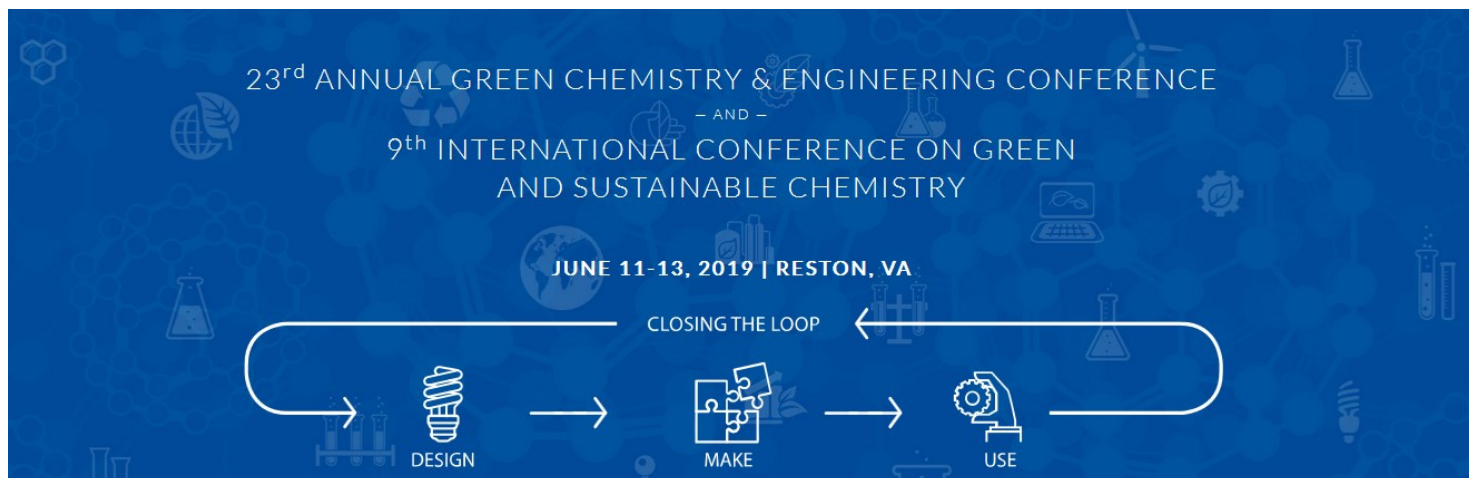
