





NORM 2020 Terminated

Termination of the 2020 Northwest Regional Meeting

Safety is a core value of the American Chemical Society, and as such the health and well-being of our members, attendees, and staff is paramount. As a result of the rapidly changing situation related to the spread of the Coronavirus disease (COVID-19), the 2020 Northwest Regional Meeting scheduled for June 29 – July 1 in Washington is being terminated.

The decision to terminate the meeting was based on several factors, including, but not limited to:

•The "Stay Home, Stay Healthy" order from Washington Governor, Jay Inslee which requires all Washingtonians to stay at home unless they need to pursue an essential activity, closing all but essential business, and banning all large gatherings.

•Concern from our attendees and presenters about the safety of travel and mass assembly in Bellingham.

•The rapidly expanding trajectory of the COVID-19 virus using tools such as the Johns Hopkins Center for Systems Science and Engineering COVID-19 tracking system to monitor the ever expanding outbreak of COVID-19 domestically and globally.



2020 Chemistry Olympiad

Annual, Multi-tiered Competition for High School Students

The U.S. Chemistry Olympiad (USNCO) is an annual, multi-tiered competition for high school students. The Puget Sound Section proctors the Local Examination in March followed by the National Examination in April. Winners of the National Examination move on to compete at the international level in the International Chemistry Olympiad (IChO) in July.

The Local Examination is used to select the finalists that will move on to the national level of the Chemistry Olympiad (i.e the National Examination). The Puget Sound Section of the ACS is allowed a maximum of 13 finalists to move on to the national level. There is a limit of 2 finalists per school.



The 2020 Chemistry Olympiad exam in the Puget Sound local section has been canceled.

The 2020 Local Exam will take place on Saturday, March 21st, 2020 from 9:00am 11:00am at Bellevue College, room S 224. The National Exam will be held in April at Bellevue College. Details TBD.

The Puget Sound Section finalists will be announced after results of the Local Examination are known.

Nominations are being accepted for the 2020 Linus Pauling Medal Award. Sponsored jointly by the ACS Portland, Puget Sound, and Oregon Local Sections, the award is presented annually in recognition of outstanding achievement in chemistry in the spirit of and in honor of Linus Pauling, a native of the Pacific Northwest. The medal will be presented at a symposium this fall at the University of Washington's Seattle campus.

The award recognizes outstanding contributions to chemistry of a character that merits national and international recognition; however, the award will not be given for work for which the nominee has already received a Nobel Prize. Scientists of all nationalities are eligible for this award. According to Pauling's express wish, it is preferred that the award honor younger scientists whenever possible.






