Pauling Award Address by Paul Chirik

Re-Imagining the Periodic Table: Addressing Sustainability Challenges in the 21st Century

How chemists interact with and ultimately use the elements on the periodic table is at the core of sustainability. Many are concerned about their "carbon footprint;" there are many more elements on the period table that are under threat to maintain our quality of life. While catalysis is a key ingredient on the pathway to a more sustainable future, the reliance on precious metals raises the elemental footprint of many processes. Earthabundant transition metals such as iron and cobalt are attractive for catalysis but understanding their fundamental chemistry and electron flow is essential for translation on to applications. This lecture will focus on the unique catalytic chemistry of iron and cobalt with specific emphasis on transformations that are unknown with precious metals. One application of particular interest is the upgrading of hydrocarbons. Methods for the cycloaddition polymerization of butadiene have been discovered that provide a new plastic microstructure that can be returned to pristine monomer upon re-exposure to the iron catalyst. The implications of these catalytic reaction on a new, responsible hydrocarbon future will be presented.

The symposium will feature other excellent speakers in the field of Organometallics and a poster session, followed by an evening banquet. Get your tickets today!






